Traditional community engagement approach

- 3. Securing and aligning collective effort to have impact.





Roles - experts

There are technical and complex issues.

This will be addressed by:

- range of community education workshops and information sessions
- series of information sheets and videos
- ongoing community communication and engagement
- hear from a range of experts, locals and sources of information
- technical advisory teams to help translate values, priorities, and into specific technical outputs
- Workshops to coordinate inputs and outputs to support work originating from the community into technical work



Role - experts

CSIRO

We are in discussions with CSIRO to support the development of the Community Vision and Blueprint for Lismore by taking on a range of roles including Trusted Advisor, Coordinator of Experts and Researcher. These roles and input from CSIRO will complement the work they are doing on flood mapping for the Northern Rivers region.

Regional flood mapping

July 2022 to June 2025

Generate high quality digital elevation data sets

Develop the hydrodynamic model for the catchment

Undertake scenario analysis recommend long term flood mitigation actions.

Northern Rivers vision, masterplan, adaptation plan.

Dec 2023 to Dec 2024

Funding secured from Disaster Ready Fund tba

Northern Rivers Joint Organisation stakeholder group established

CSIRO informs the development of a longterm vision and master plan for rebuilding the region post the 2022 flood disaster.

Nov 2023 – June 2025

Community Engagement Plan

CSIRO as Trusted Advisor, Coordinator of Experts and Researcher including:

- Advisory Group member
- workstream expertise
- conduct, source, review specific research



Role - Stakeholder Reference Group

Brings together a diverse range of groups, associations, and institutions. Reaching beyond the same small number of views and voices that traditional engagement tends to attract.

Key roles:

- Reviewing the method for any biases, as we will transparently share the end-to-end process before we start
- Making a case for the future of Lismore
- Recommending sources of information and experts that you think need to be heard from as we make this decision


